LAKE GEORGE LAND CONSERVANCY ANNOUNCES FROEHLICH FOUNDATION GRANT

(Bolton Landing, NY) — The Lake George Land Conservancy recently received a grant award of \$142,000 for land protection activities from the Helen V. Froehlich Foundation. In the years since an initial grant of \$30,000 to the Conservancy in 1995, the Froehlich Foundation's support has helped to preserve thousands of acres of natural lands in the Lake George watershed.

Executive Director Lynn Schumann said, "Over the years, the Froehlich Foundation has provided significant funding for land acquisition, stewardship and other ongoing programs and we are most grateful for the support and the confidence the foundation has placed in the Lake George Land Conservancy."

The Froehlich Foundation was created in 1993 with funds provided by the late Helen V. Froehlich. The foundation's mission is to assist with the conservation and preservation of the environment related to Lake George, including, but not limited to, matters involving the lake, land and water immediately surrounding the lake.

Founded in 1988, the Lake George Land Conservancy works to preserve the world-renowned water quality of Lake George and the rare plants and animals within the lake's 150,000-acre watershed by permanently protecting natural lands through conservation easement and fee acquisition. To date, hundreds of concerned individuals have helped the Conservancy protect more than \$16 million of land around Lake George, including 10,400 acres and 41,200 feet of shoreline.
