### **LGLC RECEIVES SUPPORT FROM LG ROTARY**

Bolton Landing, NY – The Lake George Land Conservancy (LGLC) recently received a grant of \$1,000 from the Rotary Club of Lake George. The grant will be used towards the purchase of field equipment and the design and printing of trail guides for the LGLC's Cat and Thomas Mts. Preserve located in the Town of Bolton.

The brochures for Cat and Thomas Mts. Preserve will be the first to show the preserve's new summit trail, a 2-mile path connecting the peaks of Cat and Thomas Mountains, creating a 6.5-mile loop. The trail is more challenging than the preserve's other trails, but provides an enjoyable hiking route with great views of the Lake George basin and southern Adirondacks. A free guided hike is scheduled at the preserve for October 21, from 9 am to 4 pm, to showcase the new trail. The public is invited to participate but pre-registration is required and anyone who is interested should contact the LGLC at 644-9673, or email ssmall@tnc.org.
