LGLC Receives Timberland Grant

Bolton Landing, NY – The Lake George Land Conservancy (LGLC) is pleased to announce a \$1,000 grant from the Timberland Company Foundation to support projects for an Earth Day event to be held at Gull Bay Preserve with students from St. Mary's School of Ticonderoga in 2007.

Students participating in the Earth Day event will explore vernal pools, plant tree seedlings, and build duck nesting boxes that will be placed near the preserve's main beaver pond, which is also a great blue heron rookery. The event will be co-led by staff from the LGLC, which owns and manages the preserve, and the Lake George Association. The LGLC also plans to use Timberland's grant to help purchase an interpretive panel to be placed by the rookery as an educational tool for visitors.

Timberland's mission is to "equip people to make their difference in the world." Timberland believes strongly that by partnering with effective non-profit organizations they can assist in strengthening communities around the world. This commitment is realized through the support of organizations whose innovative leadership results in lasting, positive change.

The LGLC is a non-profit organization working to preserve the world-renowned water quality of Lake George and the rare plants and animals within the lake's 150,000-acre watershed by permanently protecting natural lands.
