Bolton Landing, NY – The Lake George Land Conservancy (LGLC) invites Bolton Landing and Lake George area residents and visitors to an open house at its Macionis Family Center for Conservation on Friday, October 5, 2007, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Light refreshments will be served.

The open house offers an opportunity to tour the newly-completed building and substantial site improvements, to meet the Conservancy's staff and board members, and to learn more about the natural lands around Lake George that LGLC is working to protect, with generous local support.

The patio is used as a common area for welcoming visitors, outdoor events, press conferences and the recognition of significant preservation accomplishments in the Lake George basin. At the same time, engraved brick donations will support LGLC's critical mission to preserve the lands and waters of the lake which we all love and cherish. The engraved bricks are available in three sizes and can be purchased with a donation starting at \$100 up to \$500.
