LGLC Receives \$3,500 Equipment Grant

Bolton Landing, New York – The Lake George Land Conservancy (LGLC) recently received \$3,500 from the Norcross Wildlife Foundation to go towards the purchase of a multifunction color copy/print/scan machine for enhanced in-house production of informational and fundraising brochures, letters and newsletters.

Now entering its 21st year, LGLC recognized the need for new and enhanced educational materials in its efforts to reach out to the public about conservation. The Norcross grant has enabled LGLC to purchase an energy efficient, multifunction office machine that will greatly improve office productivity, the quality of publications printed in-house, and the ability to create time-sensitive materials with much needed flexibility. In addition, the machine will dramatically reduce the expenses associated with printing high-quality color materials, allowing important funds to be focused on land conservation rather than administrative costs.

“The new machine will act as a building block and is vital to our growth and success as an organization.” said Nancy Williams, LGLC executive director. “We are deeply grateful to the Norcross Foundation for their support toward the purchase of this office equipment.”

The Norcross Wildlife Foundation’s mission is to protect, enhance and expand habitat for wildlife primarily at the Norcross Wildlife Sanctuary (known as Tupper Hill) in the form of holdings in the surrounding towns of Monson, Wales, Holland, Brimfield and Hardwick, Massachusetts and Stafford, Connecticut; to protect wild land wherever it is threatened; to propagate, establish, restore and maintain populations of threatened and endangered plants native to New England; to provide the public with educational programs in natural and environmental science; and to support, through grants, gifts, easements and loans-for-land, the activities of a national and international constituency of not-for-profit wildlife conservation organizations.
