9 a.m. - 1 p.m.; Berry Pond Preserve, Lake George

Come out to hike one of our newest properties in honor of the American Hiking Society's National Trails Day®. Explore its namesake pond and view Lake George from its overlook. Along the way we'll clean up the trails and get them ready for the season.

SATURDAY, JUNE 20, Explore the Last Great Shoreline
10 a.m. - 1 p.m.; Last Great Shoreline, Putnam

Join us as we explore LGLC's newest acquisition on the western shore. We'll wind through forest and field, past wetlands and out to the property's viewpoint over Lake George. Hike intensity is moderate (2½ miles round-trip).

SATURDAY, JUNE 27, Family Hike to the Rookery
9 a.m. - 1 p.m.; Gull Bay Preserve, Putnam

Take a hike to an active great blue heron rookery (a nesting area and "nursery") and watch these majestic birds as they interact as a colony and get their young ready to leave the nests. Along the way learn about the natural landscape and the its plants and animals. Hike intensity is moderate (2½ miles round-trip), appropriate for most ages.
